ICRC activities


"Impartial, neutral and independent organization whose exclusively humanitarian mission is to protect the lives and dignity of victims of armed conflict and other situations of violence and to provide them with assistance"

- **2,9 million** people received health care services through 441 hospitals and 415 health centers
- 13 million people have received basic assistance,
 including food.
- 31.3 million people benefited from water engineering, building and sanitation
- 929'000 detainees were visited
- **318'363** patients underwent orthopedic services in one of the 110 centers supported by the ICRC
- Training of armed forces in IHL

- Prevention and support for victims of sexual violence
- forensic science
- Action against landmines
- Cooperation with National Societies
- humanitarian diplomacy



















Articulated prosthetic foot




 Power supply resilience in health facilities


