





# SDC GPW Strategic Framework 2017 – 2020 ...some lessons learnt





Vision: A water-secure world such as defined by UN Water "The capacity of a population to safeguard sustainable access to adequate quantities of acceptable quality water for sustaining livelihoods, human well-being, and socio-economic development, for ensuring protection against water-borne pollution and water-related disasters, and for preserving ecosystems in a climate of peace and political stability."

Overall Goal: Strengthened global response to water crises by accelerating the universal access to water, sanitation and hygiene, raising the issue of the sustainable management of water resources in economic growth, positioning water as an instrument of peace and gathering the voices around the common goal of sustainable water through transformations in the socio-economic systems leading ultimately to a water-secure world.


### Strategic Framework 2021-2024 - Component 1
